

Modern Slavery Act Statement under section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act

The Board and management of Repsol Sinopec Resources UK Limited and its subsidiaries (Group) has a zero tolerance approach to modern slavery of any kind and are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chain or in any part of our business. We are committed to responsible corporate citizenship in all that we do; the health, safety and wellbeing of all people in our supply chain is paramount and is embedded in our values.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our Group's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2017.

ORGANISATION'S STRUCTURE

Repsol Sinopec Resources UK Limited is an oil and gas exploration company headquartered in Aberdeen and operating in the UK North Sea.

Repsol Sinopec Resources UK Limited is a joint venture between Talisman Colombia Holdco Limited (TCHL), an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Repsol SA and Addax Petroleum UK Limited (APUK), an indirect wholly owned subsidiary of Sinopec International Petroleum Exploration and Production Corporation.

OUR SUPPLY CHAINS

Our supply chains incorporate the sourcing and procurement of goods and services from multiple oil and gas related sectors. We look to procure products and services from high quality suppliers capable of providing solutions that meet the Group's business requirements and standards. We achieve this through a robust selection process and ongoing management of suppliers who can reliably and predictably deliver the desired results and who fully comply with our safety, environmental, technical and ethical standards. For award of material contracts, a pre-qualification exercise is undertaken followed by a tender process which includes a risk assessment using a contractor tier assessment tool. Award recommendations are endorsed by a tender board including senior management. We are evaluating the addition of specific criteria regarding slavery and human trafficking in the qualification process.

OUR RISK ASSESSMENT

We have undertaken an internal risk assessment to identify and assess potential risks in our supply chain. The Group does not operate in jurisdictions or in a sector which has particular risks associated with it for slavery and human trafficking. To the extent risks have been identified steps have been taken to mitigate and monitor such risks.

OUR POLICIES ON SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in our supply chain or in any part of our business, and impose those same high standards on those in our supply chain and on our business partners. Our Business Conduct and Ethics Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

The Group's standard supplier contractual terms include an obligation to comply with all legislation including the Modern Slavery Act and our Business Conduct and Ethics Policy.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

Significant new suppliers are now subject to an obligatory due diligence questionnaire using an online screening/compliance tool designed by an external consultant. This questionnaire is currently being enhanced in order to identify and assess modern slavery and human trafficking risks. We take a risk based approach to monitoring our suppliers and this includes improving how we evaluate existing suppliers. When appropriate for monitoring purposes we have the right to conduct an audit.

TRAINING

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we provide training to our staff through an e-learning module which must be completed annually by all staff and contractors. We place a particular importance on awareness of forced labour and human trafficking by those in our supply chain team. Through our training programme, employees are

encouraged to identify and report any potential breaches of our business conduct and ethics policy via the Repsol Ethics and Compliance Channel.

EFFECTIVENESS IN PREVENTING MODERN SLAVERY

We are committed to improving our practices to combat slavery and human trafficking. We will review the effectiveness of the steps we have taken and, if necessary, take further steps to combat risk(s) identified after the date of this statement.
